ORDINANCE 06082021

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR HOURS OF OPERATION AND OCCUPANCY OF CITY PARK; PROVIDING PROPER SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE: AND ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

WHEREAS, City Officials desire to provide a safe environment in its City Parks for its children and other citizens; and

WHEREAS, City Officials have determined that it is necessary to set hours of operation and occupancy in its City Park in order to promote this type of environment; and

WHEREAS, that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City to enact the following Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KOSSE, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION 1: HOURS OF OPERATION OF CITY PARK PREMISES

Hours of operation of the City Park in the City of Kosse shall be from 6:00 a.m. to 11 p.m. from Monday through Sunday.

SECTION 2: SIGNS

The City shall post a sign at each Park location stating the Hours of Operation. Signs shall be in place before the Ordinance is effective.

SECTION 3: PUBLICATION

The City Secretary is directed to publish this Ordinance or a descriptive summary thereof in accordance with the requirements of the Local Government Code. This ordinance shall be effective upon publication.

SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any provision, clause, sentence, or paragraph of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not effect the provision or application of the remainder of this Ordinance and to this end the provisions of the Ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION 5: PENALTY FOR VIOLATION

Any person, firm, corporation or organization who violates, disobeys, omits, neglects or refuses to comply with, or who resists the enforcement of any provision of this article shall be fined not more than Five Hundred dollar (\$500.00) for each offense. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 6: REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES

This Ordinance repeals any conflicting ordinances or conflicting parts of ordinances of the City of Kosse.

Discussion and take action on Approving Appointment of New EDC Member. Discussion and take action on Accept Land Donation- Wright Estate. They want to donate two lots near the city park with the understanding that the land will only be used for the city park. Ronnie Funderburk made a motion to accept the donation. Harley Leazer seconded. Motion carried.

Charles Dickerson gave the Water report. Produced 1.8 million gallons. 1 major leak on the brand-new waterline lost 300,000 gallons of water. Charles is now a Ground C Water operator.

Court Clerk Christina Lockhart gave the Municipal Court report. Still having in person court. Court will be next Thursday.

Chief New gave the police report. 143 citations. 3 arrests. 6 Officers will be at the street dance and there will be 3 officers in the parade.

Karen Partin gave the EDC report. Giving the go ahead on the park grant, the pavilion is out for bid. The pre-fab concession stand price has rose \$16,000. There is 2 more years to complete the project. A grant request was approved for Olga’s Nail Salon.
